

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS TO IMPORT DOG OR CAT
FROM SARAWAK

1. Veterinary inspection is at the MAS cargo office (**NO HANDCARRY**), Kota Kinabalu International Airport.
2. The animal(s) must be identified by a microchip that can be read by an Avid, Trovan, Destron or other ISO compatible reader. The scanned microchip number must be correctly recorded on all documentation.
3. A Veterinary Health Certificate issued by the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country attesting that: -
 - 3.1. The animal(s) is healthy and free from clinical signs of infectious and contagious diseases and show no clinical signs of Rabies within 48 hours prior to shipment.
 - 3.2. The animal(s) has been vaccinated against common diseases of the exporting region/state.
 - 3.3. The animal(s) has been vaccinated against Rabies:
 - 3.3.1. Not less than six (6) months and not more than one (1) year prior to shipment; in case of primary vaccination, which should have been carried out when the animals were at least three (3) months old or
 - 3.3.2. Not more than one year prior to shipment; in the case of a booster vaccination with an inactivated virus vaccine or with a recombinant vaccine expressing the Rabies glycoprotein.
4. Rabies Neutralising Antibody Titre (RNAT) Test:
 - 4.1. The animal(s) is subjected to a Fluorescent Antibody Virus Neutralisation (FAVN) test in OIE (Office Internationale des Epizooties) approved laboratory and the serum contains at least 0.5 IU/ml.
 - 4.2. Performed on the sample that has been collected not less than 30 days and not more than 24 months prior to shipment.
 - 4.3. The laboratory report must be in English and completed on the testing laboratory's letterhead which include
 - 4.3.1. The animal(s)'s microchip number
 - 4.3.2. The blood sampling date and location
 - 4.3.3. The signature of the person issuing the laboratory report
 - 4.3.4. The test type and test result

5. The animal(s) has been treated against endo and ecto parasite within 15 days before shipment.
6. If the above conditions have been complied with upon arrival, the animal(s) will be subjected to a minimum 14 days mandatory quarantine at Veterinary Quarantine Station Kinarut, Papar.
7. Failing to comply condition no. 3 **and** no. 4, the animal(s) will be **denied entry**.
8. Failing to comply condition 1, the importer(s) will be warned/ blacklisted up to one (1) year.
9. Dog(s) that is listed in the **BANNED BREED OF DOGS** List are **PROHIBITED** from entering Malaysia.

10. Dog(s) that is listed in the **RESTRICTED BREED OF DOGS** List are allowed to enter Malaysia with conditions.
 - i. **Alaskan Malamute**

 - iv. **Estrela Mountain Dog**
 - v. **German Shepard Dog**
 - vi. **Groenendael**
 - vii. **Malinois**

 - 10.1. Dog(s) **MUST** be neutered (castrated/ spayed) before entering Malaysia; and certified by the Veterinary Authority of exporting origin.

11. The confirmed time of arrival should be made known to the Animal Quarantine Office at Kota Kinabalu International Airport Terminal 1 (KKIA T1), Tel: 088-413401 or 088-413400 (fax), at least two (2) days in advance.
12. Any imported animal(s) that shows sign of disease or died within six (6) months post quarantine, should be informed to the Veterinary Authority immediately by the owner.
